## INTRODUCTION

In the year 1972, an exclusive higher education Institution for women was established in the name of Sangam Poetess Avvaiyar by the Government of Puducherry at Karaikal as Avvaiyar Government College for Women. It was started in 1972-73 with Arts and Science Courses at Pre-University level. Later to quench the thirst of girl students for knowledge, **B.A. HISTORY** was started during 1973 – 74 and **B.A. ENGLISH LITERATURE** during 1976 – 77.

Since the girl students evinced interest to learn Science subjects, the Government started **B.Sc. BOTANY** main in 1977 – 78, **B.Sc. Mathematics** main in 1978 – 79, **B.Sc. Chemistry** main in 1980 – 81 and **B.Sc. Physics** main in 1985 – 86. As the demand for Commerce studies increased, **B.Com.** was started during 1984 – 85. With the establishment of The Pondicherry University during 1985-86, the college has been affiliated to it since 1986-87. Due to general demand, **B.Sc. Home Science** was started in 1995-96.

Avvaiyar Government College for Women, Karaikal entered in to a new era completing twenty five years of glorious service in the field of women's education in the year 1996-97 when it celebrated its Silver Jubilee. In recognition of the dedicated service rendered by the college in the development of women's education, the Government of Puducherry started Post- Graduate courses **M.A. English** and **M.Sc. Botany** from the academic year 1997-98 and **M.A. History** from the academic year 2000-2001. Moreover, **B.Sc. in Computer Science** was started in 1998-99 and in view of perennial increase in demand of job oriented courses, of late **B.Com in Corporate Secretaryship** was started from the academic year 2010-2011.

The College is enjoying the benefits of the status of 2(f) and 12(B) granted by the University Grants Commission and accredited at **B** grade by NAAC in the year 2016. An academic block opposite to Govt. Hospital has come up with the financial support of RUSA, MHRD. Avvaiyar Government College for Women, Karaikal rededicates itself in the overall progress and development of women's education in Karaikal region.

### **CERTIFICATE COURSE ON MUSHROOM CULTURE AND BIOFERTILIZERS**

The Department of Plant Science offers Career Oriented Certificate Course on Mushroom Culture and Bio-fertilizers for the students who undergo their undergraduate program in this institution. The total course fee is Rs. 400/- and the duration of the course is one year. The classes will be concurrently conducted with their routine classes. This course contains Two Theory Papers (Mushroom Culture and Bio-fertilizers) and One Practical covering the subjects of the theory.

Pondicherry University has approved the syllabi of the course (Vide Ref. No. PU/Aca-7/BOS-PO/Sc/2010-11/888 dt.16.07.2010). University has given its approval to the host institution to conduct the examination and evaluation of the papers and also to publish the results for the course (vide Ref. No. PU/AS-1/Aca-2/63-Vol.11/87-88/AGCWK/32 dt.15.02.2011).

**CO-OPERATIVE STORES**

This college has Co-operative store under the supervision of the Principal of the college as Chairperson and one of the faculty members as the Secretary. Additionally, with the help of an appointed Store-Manager, this store has been contributing its precious services to the welfare of the College Members in general and students in particular. In addition, a Board of Directors represented by the

students belonging to the various courses is also actively functional to manage the store with full transparency and accountability. The co-operative store is set up to supply the stationary items, packed food materials, snacks items and other needful items to the students and other members of the college at discount rate. Xerox facility is also available in college Co-operative store to deliver the needful services for college members at relatively low cost. Moreover, Co-operative store's account and transaction is being audited regularly by government appointed auditors and annual account statement is being sent on time to the government.

### **RULES OF ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE**

1. Each student should be in her place in the class punctually at stated periods for lecture classes, practicals, tutorials etc.
2. Attendance will be taken during each period and absence during any period in a session will be treated as absence for that whole session.
3. A student entering a class after the commencement can do so only after obtaining the permission of the teacher engaging the class. Late-comers will be marked late and three late marks will be counted as a day's absence.

4. No student shall be absent without leave. Applications for leave must be made in advance and addressed to the HOD in the following form:

**Remarks of the tutor:**

5. The Tutor can grant leave up to three days. Leave for longer periods will be granted by the Principal on the recommendation of the Tutor. All leave letters so granted shall be filed by the office and will be considered for recommending applications for condonation of shortage of attendance, within the permissible limits, at the time of sending up the candidates for the University examinations. Late applications will not be considered.
6. Leave application must always be submitted in advance. In case the absence is due to unforeseen circumstances an application for leave for the period of absence must be submitted as soon as possible and not later than the first day of return to the college. In

case if sickness extending over more than three days, the Principal may, if he deems it necessary, ask for the production of a medical certificate.

7. If a student absents herself for a week without applying for leave, her name will be struck off the rolls.
8. The total number of days of absence (with and without leave) of the students will be put up every month on the notice board. Students are advised to ensure that they do not lose attendance beyond the permissible number of days. No individual warning will be issued to them regarding their attendance position.
9. The annual certificate of attendance required by the University for admission to the University examination will be granted by the principal only on the following conditions:
  - (a) The conduct and the progress of the student have been satisfactory.
  - (b) The student has put in the prescribed minimum of 75% of attendance in the semester; and
  - (c) In case of science students 90% of the prescribed practical work has been done by them.

#### **RULES OF DISCIPLINE:**

1. The Principal of the college shall have complete power for the maintenance of the students' discipline in the college. He may

frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a temporary or permanent character, regulating the conduct of the students within the campus and outside the college.

2. The Principal shall have the power to inflict punishments like fine, suspension and rustication.
3. The Principal will directly communicate with the parents/guardians of the students who are academically weak and who do not show any improvement, whose attendance is irregular or whose conduct is unsatisfactory. The names of the students found incorrigible even after warning, may be removed from the rolls after intimation to the parents or guardians. The decision of the Principal in this matter shall be final.
4. Students of the college going on a strike in any way and indulging in acts of indiscipline and actions that may lead to dislocation of work in the institution shall immediately forfeit their scholarship, fee concessions etc, such students may even be suspended or terminated.
5. Rotations or complaints from individuals or groups to any higher authority must be submitted through the Principal.

### **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR:**

1. Each student must attend the college decently dressed. Tight garments such as Jeans, Pants, etc must be avoided.

2. On the teacher entering the class room, the students shall rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit or till the teacher takes his seat.
3. Every student must obey the teachers and respectfully carry out their instructions. The students shall observe politeness towards the non-teaching staff of the college and behave decorously with their fellow students.
4. No student shall leave the class room or laboratory without the teacher's permission or until after the teacher has left the room or has asked the class to disperse.
5. Students must observe strict silence in the classes and listen to the lectures attentively, without distracting the attention of others.
6. Students must move silently when changing their class rooms. They must observe strict silence during the lunch break and the interval between two periods.
7. Students are forbidden from making any sort of noise in the corridors or vicinity of rooms, where classes are in progress. Students having no classes must remain quiet and spend their time usefully in the library/reading room.
8. Students are expected to be present in their classrooms or laboratories at the appointed hour.
9. Each student is expected to provide herself with all the necessary text- books. Science students must bring their observation note-



books to the practical sessions and submit their fair record notebooks regularly on the appointed dates. Failure to do so may entail her losing the day's practical work.

10. Each student should care for the college property and refrain from indulging in any activity that may damage it. Students to whom books or any other college property are entrusted will be held responsible for their preservation in a good condition and in the event of their being lost, they will be required to replace them or repay their cost. Any student breaking or damaging any college property will be required to pay the cost of repair or replacements. In case of willful damage, she will also be punished in such manner as the Principal may think fit.
11. Students are prohibited from organizing any meeting or entertainments in the college or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
12. Students guilty of going over to other colleges and institutions to take part in acts of indiscipline such as organizing demonstrations and strikes would be deemed culpable and would be punished accordingly.
13. Students shall not hold meetings for criticizing the conduct of the University or the college authorities. Such meetings shall be deemed unlawful and the Principal may take such action as he/she deems necessary.

14. Students are strictly prohibited from using any mobile or cell phones in the college campus, even in silent mode also is not acceptable.
15. Ragging is a punishable offence to the extent of summary expulsion from the college.
16. The name of the college or its authorities shall not be used in any publications or in any manner without the permission of the Principal.
17. No class or group of student should engage themselves in any public activity, even on purely social nature, without the Principal's permission.
18. Students should refrain from participating in party or commercial politics.

### **TUTORIAL SYSTEM**

Each student on the college roll is assigned to the care of one of the members of the staff who will assist and advise her on any matter, personal or academic. There will be a wards' meeting once a week when the tutors concerned will meet their wards and take note of their progress in their studies, health and other problems. The wards should not hesitate to consult their tutors on all matters for which they need their advice.

The leave application should be submitted through the tutor. The tutor shall maintain a record of the leave taken by his/her wards. When the tutor is on leave, the student should wait for his/her return to duty to submit the leave application.

### **LABORATORIES**

During practical, the student should handle the apparatus carefully. All breakages, losses etc., must be reported to the lecturers concerned as soon as they occur. The cost of things so broken or lost will be recovered from the students concerned.

### **N.S.S.**

In order to inculcate courage, self – confidence, the spirit of social service among the students, National Service Scheme is functioning actively in this college. The entire student should enroll themselves as volunteers in the National Service Scheme at the time of admission. All the volunteers should do 120 hours of social service. Apart from this a ten days special camp will be organized by the N.S.S unit of the college. The volunteers should actively participate in the special camp. Certificates are issued to those volunteers who successfully complete the camp.

### **N.C.C.**

To develop the students character, comradeship, discipline, leadership quality, secular outlook, to provide leadership in all walks

of life and to be always available for the service of nation, N.C.C (National Cadets Corps) Army wing girls was started at A.G.C.W. in the year 2009 and is functioning under the N.C.C group Headquarters, Puducherry. At the time of admission, the students who are willing can enroll themselves as cadets in the N.C.C. The successful enrolled N.C.C. cadets will be awarded with certificate B and certificate C under the Ministry of Defense, New Delhi. Excelling cadets are awarded with Best Cadet Awards and are encouraged to enroll themselves in the disciplined service of the Nation.

### **LIBRARY RULES**

1. The Library is open to the students and the staff of the college.
2. The library will remain open on all working days from 9.30 am to 4.45 p.m.
3. Strict silence is to be observed in and around the Library. Failure to observe this rule will attract severe disciplinary action.
4. Students should not bring their personal belongings such as bags, boxes, note books, etc., inside the Library. However they may be permitted to bring sheets of paper for taking notes.
5. Readers shall be responsible for any damage, or injury done to the books or other reading materials and shall be required to replace such books / materials at their own cost.

6. While borrowing a book the borrower should examine the condition of the book. Damage, if any, should be brought to the notice of the library staff.
7. Writing, marking, underlining or disfiguring the reading materials will attract severe disciplinary action.
8. In case replacement is not possible for a book / periodicals lost or damaged, the cost will be recovered as noted below:
  - (i) Double the book value of the book/ periodical lost or damaged if it is available in the market.
  - (ii) Four times the book value of the book / periodical if it is out of print.
9. Library borrowers' tickets will be issued to the members and books can be borrowed against the library tickets only. The number of tickets that one is entitled will be decided by the college council.
10. Members are responsible for the library tickets issued to them. Sub-lending of books / transfer of tickets is not permitted.
11. Loss of library tickets should be reported immediately to the Librarian. Duplicate tickets / clearance will be issued only after a month from the date of report. During this period the member should try to trace out the lost ticket.

12. The borrower to whom a ticket is issued shall be responsible for any loss or non-return of book(s) issued against that library ticket. A fine of rupees two per ticket will be collected for the loss.
13. The validity of the library tickets in the case of outgoing students expires on the last working day of the college. Therefore they should surrender the tickets on or before the last working day.
14. The library is following closed access system. The student should make a request in the prescribed form available in the library for the issue of books before 1.00 PM. Books will be issued between 3.00PM - 4.00 PM on the same day.
15. Books are generally issued for a fort-night. Extension of time will be granted in case there is no demand for the same book. More than three consecutive renewals will not however be allowed.
16. Facility for making reservation of books is available in the library.
17. Borrowers should return the books on or before the stipulated dates. Overdue charges @ 10 paise per book per day will be collected from the defaulters for the first 14 days of default. For the subsequent days a fine @ 25 paise per day will be collected.
18. Absence from the college will not be taken as a valid reason for the late return of books.
19. Certificates / Hall tickets will be issued only after clearing all the outstanding dues in the library.

20. The Librarian may recall any books issued even if the loan period is not over.
21. Books categorized as reference will not be lent out.
22. The library staff will be glad to assist the readers in selecting the required reading materials.
23. The above rules are applicable to the Book Bank books also with modifications regarding loan period, issue methods and eligibility criteria.

### **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

The college magazine will be published once a year. The editor of the magazine will be assisted by an Editorial Board consisting of the staff members and students.

### **COLLEGE DAY**

College day will be celebrated every year in the second semester.

### **SPORTS DAY**

The sports day is celebrated in the second semester.

### **FEES**

The fees for each semester should be paid on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> working day of each semester. Payments in installments will not be entertained. If a student fails to pay the fees due by her on the day fixed for payment she will have to pay a fine of twenty- five paisa per day and if the fee is not paid within the end of the month her name

will be struck off the rolls. If re-admitted she must, in addition to the fees and fines due, pay a re-admission fee of Rs.2.00.

### **STUDENTS' COUNCIL**

A students' council will be set up as per the following guide lines based on the order of the Education Department vide Note No. Edn/Dtd. 54613/coll.Edn/91. Dated 10.09.1991.

1. The students' council shall consist of all the elected class representatives in the college. They will elect a President, Secretary and a Treasurer.
2. The ex-officio President of the council will be the Principal of the college. The ex-officio President can nominate two staff advisers to assist him/her in the meetings of the students' council.
3. All decisions taken by the students' council should be taken by a majority of the total members present and they should be put up to the Principal for his/her assent and approval. The quorum for the meetings of the students' council shall be one-third of the council members.
4. Any dispute relating to the conduct of the election of the students' council shall be referred to the Director of Collegiate & Technical Education whose decision shall be final.



5. Secretary (Education) shall be the authority to call for any file relating to the election of the students' council of any college and to examine its propriety, validity and correctness.

### **PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION**

All the teachers of the college and all the parents of the students shall be members of this association. This association intended to foster good relationship between teachers, students and their parents. This association helps to create in the members a keen interest in the affairs of the college, to institute prizes and scholarships for the students and to provide amenities for the students and the staff.

### **GENERAL COUNCIL**

1. The Principal shall be the patron of the respective council.
2. The council shall jointly participate / organize all functions of the institution under the overall guidance of the Principal and the staff advisers to the council.
3. The functions of the respective departments shall be organized by the Secretary of the Department concerned. (The elected Chairman and General Secretary will also continue to be the Secretary for the subject / forum area of activity from which they have been chosen).

4. In all such cases the council / the Secretaries concerned may co-opt other students / volunteers or members with the prior approval of the Principal to help them to organize the functions.

### **PERFORMANCE OF STUDENTS**

The performance of students in attendance, discipline and college examinations will be communicated to the parent / guardian through progress reports after the completion of each term. The progress reports will be signed by the parent / guardian and should be returned to the Principal within 15 days of receipt of the progress card. If any student fails to submit the progress card in time, her parents / guardians will be summoned by the Principal. They will also be summoned if their daughters / wards are found wanting in discipline/attendance/performance in the college examinations. Their failure to appear will be viewed seriously by the College Council.

### **ACADEMIC PROGRESS**

A student is expected to keep steady progress in her studies. If a student is indifferent in student or her attendance is poor, she may face termination from the college. The name of the student may be struck off from the rolls for unauthorized absence from the classes. Students having less than 75% of attendance will not be permitted to write the annual examination.

## **THE COLLEGE COUNCIL**

The College Council shall consist of the Principal and the Heads of all the Main departments and the IQAC Co-ordinator .

### **MONTHLY TEST**

The monthly test will be conducted by the departments concerned. All students must take them. The performance of the students will be assessed carefully. Weak students will thus be identified and given proper facilities for their further improvements in studies.

### **RAGGING**

Ragging is totally banned in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and or abetting is liable to be punished appropriately.

#### ***Ragging means the following:***

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which has the effect of causing or generating a sense ordinary course and which has

the effect of causing effect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

## **PUNISHMENTS**

### ***At the Institution level:***

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional/ national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
6. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for period ragging from 1 to 4 semesters.
9. Expulsion from the institution for a specified period.
10. Fine ragging between Rs. 25,000/ to Rs. 1 lakh.

**11. Collective Punishment:** When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

**Note:** Those students who wish to get Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate from the College office should apply for the same at least two days before the required date.
